# Spotlight on a noteworthy Animal Scientist:

## Emmanuel Caldera



Emmanuel Caldera is currently a Ph.D. student in the Department of Animal Sciences at Colorado State University. Emmanuel grew up on Aurora Dairy in Dublin, TX. During high school, Emmanuel worked as a part-time employee at Aurora Dairy where he gained valuable experience working with cattle and people. He soon realized the importance and benefits of being bilingual (Spanish and English) in the agriculture industry. As a first generation student he attended Tarleton State University and obtained his Bachelor's degree in Animal Science with a minor in Biology in 2009. In 2010, he came to Colorado State University to attend graduate school, and in the fall of 2012 he obtained his Master's degree in Animal Sciences studying ruminant nutrition under the guidance of Dr. Terry Engle. He is now continuing his education by pursuing a Ph.D. degree at CSU in ruminant nutrition. His area of research is focused on micronutrient metabolism in beef and dairy cattle. His Ph.D. research involves examining *in vitro* and *in vivo* solubility of IntelliBond and sulfate forms of copper, zinc, and manganese. Throughout his research he's received the collaboration of his fellow graduate students as well as undergraduate students which has successfully allowed him to conduct numerous research projects for his program. He continues to work with various faculty members and graduate and undergraduate students in attempts to accomplish his goals of achieving a PH.D. degree at CSU in ruminant nutrition. Students are always allowed to be involved with his research and he's extremely appreciative of the help he's received in the past.
