Spotlight on an Animal Scientist

Lisa Nulton



Lisa Nulton is a M.S. student in the Department of Animal Sciences at Colorado State University. Lisa grew up in Rochester, New York on her family's small horse farm where she developed a passion for the equine industry. During her childhood, she participated in the local 4-H horse program for 7 years and showed in hunter/jumper and eventing arenas. In 2011, Lisa graduated from Delaware Valley College with a B.S. Degree in Animal Science with a concentration in Equine Science. Between undergraduate and graduate school at CSU, Lisa spent 5 years working with Standardbred breeding facilities and participating in national and international Standardbred horse sales. She began her Master's Degree in Animal

Science here at CSU in the fall of 2012. Lisa is investigating the presence of exogenous plant miRNA, absorbed from feed stuffs, in equine serum and tissue. This project is exploring the novel role of plant miRNAs as a potential nutrient that can directly influence gene expression and function. While working on her research, Lisa has been able to provide several undergraduates and fellow graduate students the opportunity to be involved in her project. Also, Lisa has had the opportunity to collaborate on additional research projects focused in equine reproduction.
