

## Development of Undergraduate Major Committee (DUMC)

### I Subcommittee Reports

- A. Post-mortem of BSPM major (*Janet, Frank*) (Written report provided via email)
  1. Main issues with previous major:
    - i. The differences and advantages between this major and others such as biology were not clear to potential students.
    - ii. The major lacked name recognition.
    - iii. The major had a history of under performance and low enrollments, prior to its transfer to the department.
    - iv. Faculty did not feel connected to the major.
    - v. Sufficient faculty effort was not available for recruiting, retention and teaching. It was suggested that 3-4 faculty who were passionate about the major and its students would have been necessary to be successful.
    - vi. Course requirements were developed from available classes. New classes tailored to the needs of the major were not developed.

- B. Assessing Student Needs
  1. State Demography
    - i. Employment trends
      1. Education is a growth area for the state
    - ii. Population trends
      1. Biggest increases in Denver to Ft. Collins corridor
    - i. Colorado Paradox- Greater proportion of migrants have bachelors and graduate degrees.
  2. Focus groups with high school, undergraduate and graduate students (*Cini, Todd, Andrew*)
    - i. Do focus group in spring during FFA events on campus during spring
    - ii. On campus students and off-campus (high school)
    - iii. Growing interest in agriculture among suburban and urban children
    - iv. Three or four focus groups before the end of this semester
      1. Ag ambassadors (students who already know about CAS and agriculture)
        - a. What majors are they?
        - b. What are their perspectives on pests? What do they think about this subject?
        - c. These students have already decided to be in agriculture, and this population is shrinking, so is interviewing them worthwhile?

      4. FFA Chapter in Longmont
    - v. Natural sciences learning community may be a good group to interview
      1. Join learning communities as freshmen; Co-housed in dorm
    - vi. It would be very telling to interview students who **left** CSU.

C. Assessment of business, industry, management needs (Kirk, Cris, Franck)

1. Cris interviewed a person responsible for recruiting at Monsanto, and here are the things they are looking for in new hires out of college in our field, by order of importance:
  - i. ability to work collaboratively with others
  - ii. creativity, demonstrated leadership in initiating projects and having ideas
  - iii. broad training, as in ability to work across disciplines, not knowledge of too many areas necessarily
  - iv. communication skills: comfortable with preparing and giving presentations, preparing reports
  - v. quantitative skills: statistics, excel files
  - vi. He mentioned that they usually provide specific training for the position being filled, so general knowledge rather than specific knowledge and improved communication are the key elements.
2. Kirk shared a poster (which will become a manuscript with more data ) and an article about employer needs in plant pathology
3. Need to incorporate learning the skills employers want into classes, curriculum-wide.
4. Include information about employer needs and how this major will provide students with the needed skills and knowledge in recruiting material.
